About the Institute

There has never been a more significant time to be involved in data science and Al.

There is growing recognition of the importance of these technologies to our economic and social future: the so-called fourth industrial revolution. The technical challenge of keeping our data secure and private has grown in its urgency and importance. At the same time, voices from academia, industry, and government are coming together to debate how these technologies should be governed and managed.

The Alan Turing Institute, as the UK's national institute for data science and artificial intelligence, plays an important role in driving forward advances in these technologies in order to change the world for the better.

The Institute is named in honour of Alan Turing, whose pioneering work in theoretical and applied mathematics, engineering and computing is considered to have laid the foundations for modern-day data science and artificial intelligence. The Institute's goals are to undertake world-class research, apply its research to real-world problems, drive economic impact and societal good, lead the training of a new generation of scientists, and shape the public conversation around data and algorithms.

After launching in 2015 with government funding from EPSRC and five founding universities, the Institute has grown an extensive network of university partners from across the UK and launched a number of major partnerships with industry, public and third sector. Today it is home to more than 500 researchers, a rapidly growing team of in house research software engineers and data scientists and a business team.

The Institute's objectives and research priorities are as follows:

- Advance world class research
 Innovate and develop world-class research in data science and artificial intelligence that supports next generation theoretical developments and is applied to real-world problems, generating the creation of new businesses, services, and jobs.
- Train the leaders of the future
 Train new generations of data science and artificial intelligence leaders with the necessary breadth and depth of technical and ethical skills to match UK's growing industrial and societal needs.
- Lead the public conversation
 Through agenda-setting research, public engagement, and expert technical advice, drive new and innovative ideas which have a significant influence on industry, government, regulation, or societal views, or which have an impact on how data science and artificial intelligence research is undertaken.

The role

Reporting to the Chair of the Board of Trustees the trustee role will oversee and provide constructive challenge to senior leadership on the activities of the Institute in accordance with its charitable objects.

The duties and responsibilities of trustees includes, without limitation, the below.

Duties and responsibilities

- To ensure compliance with the Institute's constitutional documents ("Articles of Association" and "Joint Venture Agreements"), charity law, company law and any other relevant legislation.
- To ensure clear strategic direction and contribute to setting overall policy, defining goals, setting targets and evaluating performance.
- To approve each of the Business Plan, the Annual Budget and every subsequent Five-Year budget.
- Approving the adoption of the Scientific and Innovation Strategy.
- Ensuring that the organisation applies its resources exclusively in pursuance of its charitable objects for the benefit of the public.
- Safeguarding the Institute's reputation and promoting its vision and mission.

- Protecting the Institute's assets by overseeing the proper investment of its funds.
- To approve the Institute's Annual Report and Accounts and receiving the auditor's report.
- To stay up to date with charity law, company law and other relevant legislation.
- To use any specific skills, knowledge or experience to help the Board of Trustees reach sound decisions.
- To maintain appropriate confidentiality, disclose any conflicts of interest and abide by the Institute's Code of Conduct policy, values, policies and procedures.
- Uphold the highest standards of integrity, honesty and transparency.
