Main purpose of job	
<p>Options ensures high quality delivery of a considerable portfolio of health and nutrition programmes on behalf of a variety of clients, globally. We work with partners to strengthen all the health systems building blocks, often focussed on improving sexual, reproductive, maternal, new-born, child and adolescent health (RMNCAH) and nutrition. Evidence, accountability and social change are important elements of our work.</p> <p>The role of Technical Advisor, Health Financing, is to provide technical support in health financing to Options' portfolio of programmes in low and middle income countries (both Anglophone and Francophone). In particular, the post-holder will support the design and implementation of approaches to leverage domestic financing for health as well as promoting the effective and efficient use of these resources to ensure sustained uptake of quality RMNCAH services. This may include, for example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The development of country-specific evidence briefs to be used by the Ministry of Health to advocate for increased investment in RMNCAH • Supporting the tracking of national and sub-national budgets and the use of this evidence to advocate for more and better spending on health • Working with programme staff to build the capacity of government officials to effectively develop and execute their budget • Provide technical assistance to governments as they design and implement health financing reforms, with particular focus on domestic resource mobilisation and purchasing arrangements • Working with programme staff and consortium partners to build capacity of civil society to identify opportunities to engage in the budget process and to influence budget decisions. <p>The post-holder will contribute actively to the growth and development of the organisation and to the delivery of its mission by contributing to generation of new business opportunities.</p>	

The post is London based with regular overseas travel, as agreed with the line manager. Applicants must be eligible to work in the UK and must be willing and able to undertake this work in both French and English.

Main duties

Technical Assistance to Programmes

- Provide technical expertise and quality assurance for technical inputs as part of the Evidence for Action (E4A) and Women's Integrated Sexual Health (WISH) Programmes with a focus on domestic resource mobilisation and use.
- Undertake technical assistance assignments in health systems strengthening and health financing. This will be through on-going inputs and one-off assignments in both Francophone and Anglophone countries.
- Contribute to the development of project results frameworks, theories of change and support their use for effective programme delivery
- Provide technical support to national systems and skills development to country stakeholders including programme staff, government officials and civil society organisations.
- Interface with national governments and other stakeholders, solicit feedback and redress areas of concern
- Enable technical exchange and learning between programme staff
- Advise on areas of potential risk and support the development of mitigation strategies

Proposal Development, communication and dissemination

- Support the technical design and development of proposals, especially relating to health systems strengthening and health financing
- Provide inputs into technical components of proposals being developed by other members of the Technical Team
- Utilise existing networks to support new business development for Options
- Utilise opportunities to represent Options effectively and develop networks to help further Options mission.

Organisational learning

- Provide strategic support to Options' London team, overseas teams and consultants as required in relation to health financing.
- Participate in and contribute to the Options' Community of Practice with a focus on health financing.
- Contribute to the publication and dissemination of research and learning from Country Programmes
